Article 05 Operating Budget

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Thousand One Hundred Forty-Five Dollars (\$400,145) to defray Town charges for the ensuing year. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the Selectmen)

Article 06 Highway Department Budget

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Ninety-One Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Eight Dollars (\$291,158) for maintenance, expenses, salaries, supplies, equipment and street lighting for the Highway Department for the ensuing year. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the Selectmen)

Article 07 Highway Equipment CRF

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000) to be placed in the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the Selectmen)

Article 08 Road Material CRF

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) to be placed in the Road Material Capital Reserve Fund. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the Selectmen)

Article 09 Property Revaluation CRF

To see if the Town will vote to raise and



appropriate the sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000) to be placed in the Property Revaluation Capital Reserve Fund. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the Selectmen)

Article 10 Bridge Replacement and Repair CRF

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) to be placed in the Bridge Replacement and Repair Capital Reserve Fund. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the Selectmen)

Article 11 Legal Expense CRF

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) to be placed in the Legal Expense Capital Reserve Fund. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the Selectmen)

Article 12 Welfare and General Assist Trust

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) to be placed in the Welfare and General Assistance Trust Fund. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the Selectmen)

Article 13 Transfer Station Equipment & Repair CRF

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) to be placed in the Transfer Station Equipment & Repair Capital Reserve Fund. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the Selectmen)

Article 14 Any other business

To transact any other business that may legally come before the Meeting.
